SECRETARY'S NOTE

Dear beloved in Christ:

Greetings to you all in the precious name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

As per the church calendar, we are in the "lent" season. The word "Lent" comes from the Teutonic (Germanic) word for springtime. Lent can be viewed as a spiritual spring cleaning; a time to reflect on our life, cleaning things which hinder our relationships with Jesus Christ and with others and to attain spiritual discipline. "Lent" Is also the time for "sacrifice"; giving up something that is our "favorite". Jesus spent 40 days in the desert before beginning his public ministry, several years before he was crucified. The Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke, individual, yet similar, interpretations of Christ's message, each tell of Jesus spending 40 days in the desert, where he fasted, prayed and was tempted by the devil. After this he went to Galilee where he called his first disciples and began his public ministry. The 40 days of Lent are also a time to remember and imitate the life and ministry of Jesus as we prepare to commemorate his death and resurrection at Easter. I invite all of you to join in for special services, meditations, fasting and giving during this lent season. I also applaud our youth for organizing the "city impact" as part of our ministry during this "lent" season.

This is the first newsletter after the new 2015 office bearers took charge. I am excited to serve you and the Lord and with our Achen's excellent leadership this will be an exciting year for all of us as a church community.

As we recognize the excellent service done by our 2014 office bearers and the Executive Committee, my special thanks to all of them for a smooth transition and for all the help given to the new members. During our last Executive committee meeting we organized all our sub-committees for 2015.

I would like to request your prayers and support to carry out my responsibilities in the New Year. I would encourage you to participate and "get involved" in the day-to-day activities of the church.
