From the Vicar's Desk



Dearly beloved in Christ,

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

Resurrection represents new life, new hope, new beginnings.

Resurrection means there is hope in most desperate circumstances. Hope is at the heart of the resurrection message as the despair of Good Friday is followed by the joy of Easter morning. Hope is the belief that things are going to get better. It means that God is powerful and nothing is beyond His control. Resurrection reminds us that though evil men put Christ to death, they never got the final word. God gets the final word, so there is hope in the most desperate circumstances. When we hear about

the news which overwhelms us, resurrection reminds us that God is on His throne. He is in charge no matter how dark it gets in our life.

Resurrection means that God always keeps his promises. In Matthew 16:21-22 "From that time on Jesus began to explain to his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things at the hands of the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and on the third day be raised to life. Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. "Never, Lord!" he said. "This shall never happen to you!"

Peter did not hear the end of the message. All he heard was the part of the Son of Man going to suffer many things and be killed. Hence he responds, "Never, Lord! This shall never happen to you!" He didn't hear 'on the third day be raised'. He heard it with his physical ears but did not get the promise of resurrection. The disciples had to go through a lot of stress, anxiety, fear because they didn't really hear and lay hold of the promises of God. In a similar way we can avoid a lot of stress, anxiety, and fear if we remember that God always keeps his promises. Our life would be different, if we believed and laid hold of the promises of God.



- 2 Like a fisherman, Babylonians caught men like fish in their net and rejoiced and was ___.
- 3 Habakkuk was emotionally and intellectually wrestling with God, then he decided to wait patiently on the Lord to see what answer __ to give to his complaints. (Ex.3:14-15)
- 5 "The sovereign Lord is my __; He makes my feet like the feet of a deer, he enables me to go on the heights"
- 10 Having received the answer that __ would be destroyed, Habakkuk understood that the sovereign God was using this nation to discipline Israel.
- 12 Babylonians made __ and burned incense to their "nets", that is their military strength.
- 14 Habakkuk's second question to the Lord: "Why are you silent while the wicked swallow up those more __ than themselves?"
- 15 Habakkuk's first question to the Lord is, "Why do you __ wrong among the people of Judah?" How long must he call for help about the violence, destruction, and

injustice?

- 17 The second assurance of God in Hab.2: Though the world is filled with violence and injustice, one day the earth will be filled with the __ of the glory of the Lord.
- 21 "The revelation awaits an __ time. It speaks of the end and will not prove false. Though it linger, wait for it; it will certainly come and will not delay."
- 22 The leopards, wolves, and __ are the three animals that God used to compare Babylonians' army strength.
- 23 In response to Habakkuk's second question, God replied to him "Write down the revelation (what will happen to Babylon) on tablets so that a __ may run with it. (spread the message)
- 24 In Habakkuk 1:8 & 14-15, Babylonians are compared to __ and fishermen. Jer. 16:16

- 1 Babylonians were puffed up and not righteous. The first assurance of God in Hab.2: "The righteous will live by his __." The key verse of this book is quoted in Rom. 1:17; Gal.3:11; Heb.10:38
- 4 Knowledge of the Lord and His deeds filled Habakkuk with awe. He asked the Lord to renew the nation and in wrath remember __.
- 6 The Lord answered Habakkuk's cries, "I am going to do something in your days that you would not believe even if you were told. I am raising up the ruthless Babylonians against His people". Apostle Paul quoted the same verse in Acts 13:41 to the unbelieving Jews because they rejected the word of God, he would turn to the __ for their salvation.
- 7 In Hab. 3:3-15, Habakkuk recalled the omnipotence of God that led the Israelites out of Egypt through the wilderness into Canaan. His glory covered the heavens and His splendor was like the __.
- 8 At the command of Joshua, Sun stood still over Gibeon and the moon over the valley of __.
- 9 Habakkuk said, "we will not die". Probably he was thinking of the covenant that God made with __. "I will make you into a great nation"
- 11 Habakkuk (621 609 B.C) was the last minor prophet to the Southern Kingdom before the Babylonian captivity (pre-exilic) in 606 B.C, just as Micah was the last prophet to the Northern Kingdom before the __ captivity in 721 B.C.
- 12 Habakkuk began this book with a complaint to the Lord and after he received the revelation from God, he ends it with a song. __ and Selah are musical terms.
- 13 Hab. 2:6-20 talks about God's judgment to Babylon (Dan.5:30) and the woes. Woe to him who piles up stolen goods and makes himself wealthy by extortion; woe to him
- who builds his realm by unjust gain; woe to him who builds a city with bloodshed; woe to him who gives drink to his __ till they are drunk; woe to him who says to wood, 'Come to life
- 16 The secret of triumphant living: "Though the fig tree does not bud and there are no grapes on the vines, though the olive crop fails and the fields produce no food .. yet I will __ in the Lord". Phil.4:4

18 Babylonians were a feared and dreaded people. Deut. 28:47-48. Because the Israelites didn't serve the Lord joyfully in the time of their prosperity, they will serve the __ the Lord sends against them.

19 The third assurance of God in Hab.3: Empires may rise and fall, but the Lord is in His holy __, let all the earth be silent before Him. He is King of Kings and Lord of Lords.

20 As for Babylonians, their god is their own strength (Dan.4:30). In his dilemma, Habakkuk acknowledged the nature of God, which are everlasting and __.

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
